With construction well underway, we anticipate completion in August 2020. We'll soon be scheduling a dedication celebration. Stay tuned for that exciting news!

Announcing a Challenge Grant from THE MARY MORTON PARSONS FOUNDATION

The Mary Morton Parsons Foundation approved a two-to-one challenge grant. They will give \$300,000 if we can raise the 2:1 match of \$600,000. These gifts will bring us much closer to our \$4 million need. We thank those of you who have already jumped on board – and hope you, too, will prayerfully consider a gift!

2020 marks the 45th Anniversary of Westminster Canterbury Richmond's opening and the 40th Anniversary of the creation of Westminster Canterbury Foundation. During that time, much has been made possible by the spirit of generosity that is so evident throughout our campus. This year, through our events and publications, we celebrate these anniversaries and your part in them!



then: Originally built on 25 acres



now: Westminster Canterbury Richmond expanded to 50 acres in 2000 and to 60 acres in 2018.



then: Mary Morton Parsons Health Center opened with 133 semiprivate rooms for skilled and intermediate nursing care. By 1984, we were the only facility in Richmond that had converted to all private rooms.

"Everyone knows you move here because eventually you may need healthcare. But I dreaded my first stay after surgery. I was so wrong - I was treated so well that I didn't want to leave!"



now: Today, we also offer two levels of assisted living and three levels of memory support, ensuring the best care at any stage of life.



then: The founding purpose of Westminster Canterbury was to provide a Fellowship Program for seniors-in-need, giving security and peace of mind that housing, meals, medical care and vital living were guaranteed. In the beginning, 93 of our first 375 residents lived here thanks to the generosity of donors.

now: Today, around 110 of our 830 residents receive Fellowship support annually. A total of 560 seniors have received \$76 million in support for a safe retirement since we opened our doors!

Your gifts to the Annual Fellowship Fund totaled \$1.7 million in 2019.

"Without the Fellowship Program, I truly don't know what would have become of me in my retirement years. H's been a lifeline for me."



then: Pastoral Care services began with a simple chapel and no chaplains on staff until the 1980s. Programming consisted of three services a week.



now: Four chaplains offer 25 weekly on-campus Pastoral Care programs that will be enhanced by our Spiritual Center now under construction.
